who had never worked together before to make a greater impact in their communities. She has been the leader of multiple nonprofit organizations with missions such as promoting stronger families and protecting mental health, rehabilitation, disabilities, and workforce development. She has served as the Interim President and CEO of the National Human Services Assembly; Everybody Wins DC; The Bazelon Center for Mental Health Law; Thompson-Markward Hall; The National Healthy Mothers, Healthy Babies Coalition; and has run 3 non-profit organizations, including Melwood where she led over 1,600 employees at over 70 sites and managed an \$86 million budget.
